#### **IP RATING**

An IP rated lighting fixture is commonly installed in outdoor environments and has been designed with an enclosure that effectively protects the ingress (entry) of external foreign objects such as dust and water. The Ingress Protection (IP) rating system is commonly expressed as "IP" followed by two numbers (i.e. IP65), where the numbers define the degree of protection. The first digit (Foreign Bodies Protection) indicates the extent of protection against particles entering the fixture and the second digit (Water Protection) indicates the extent of protection against water entering the fixture. **An IP65 rated lighting fixture**, such as this one, has been designed and tested to protect against the ingress of dust (6) and low-pressure water jets from any direction (5).

PLEASE NOTE: The charging base is NOT rated for protection against moisture or dust intrusion of any kind, and should be used in dry indoor environments only!

#### WARRANTY RETURNS

All returned service items, whether under warranty or not, must be freight pre-paid and accompanied by a return authorization (R.A.) number. The R.A. number must be clearly written on the outside of the return package. A brief description of the problem as well as the R.A. number must also be written down on a piece of paper included in the shipping carton. - Be sure to save the packing carton for use in the event that the device needs to be returned to the manufacturer for service.
- Charging base is designed for use in dry indoor environments only! Do NOT expose to rain, dust, or moisture!
- Be sure that the voltage of the power source matches the required voltage for the device.
- Do not open up the device for any reason. There are no user serviceable parts inside.
- Disconnect the device's main power when left unused for long periods of time.
- Never connect this device to a dimmer pack.
- Do not attempt to operate this device if it has been damaged in any way.
- Never operate this device with the cover removed.
- Do not attempt to operate this device if the power cord has been frayed or broken.
- Do not attempt to remove or break off the ground prong from the electrical cord. This prong is used
  to reduce the risk of electrical shock and fire in case of an internal short.
- Disconnect from main power before making any type of connection.
- Never block the ventilation holes. Always be sure to mount this device in an area that will allow proper ventilation. Allow about 6" (15cm) between this device and a wall.
- Always mount this device in a safe and stable matter.
- Please route your power cord out of the way of foot traffic. Power cords should be routed so they are not likely to be walked on, or pinched by items placed upon or against them


- A. The power-supply cord or the plug has been damaged.
- B. Objects have fallen on, or liquid has been spilled into, the device.
- C. The appliance does not appear to operate normally or exhibits a marked change in performance.

#### SAFETY GUIDELINES

- 1. Remove and immediately recycle or dispose of used batteries according to local regulations and keep away from children. Do NOT dispose of batteries in household trash or incinerate.
- 2. Even used batteries may cause severe injury or death.
- 3. Call a local poison control center for treatment information.
- 4. This product contains a type CR2025 3V button cell.
- 5. The button cell is Non-rechargeable batteries are not to be recharged.

## OVERVIEW





#### **DMX ADDRESSING**

All fixtures should be given a DMX starting address when operating with a DMX controller, in order to ensure that the correct fixture responds to the correct control signal. This digital starting address is the channel number from which the fixture starts to "listen" to the digital control signal sent out from the DMX controller. This starting DMX address is assigned by setting the correct DMX address on the digital control display on the fixture.

You can set the same starting address for all fixtures or a group of fixtures, or set different addresses for each individual fixture. Setting all fixtures to the same DMX address will cause all fixtures to react in the same way. In this case, please note that changing the settings of one channel will affect all the fixtures simultaneously.

If you set each fixture to a different DMX address, each unit will start to "listen" to the channel number you have set, based on the quantity of DMX channels of each fixture. That means changing the settings of one channel will only affect the selected fixture.

As an example, when operating this fixture model in 4 channel mode, you should set the starting DMX address of the first unit to 1, the second unit to 5 (4 + 1), the third unit to 9 (4 + 4 + 1), and so on. (See the chart below for more details.)

#### WIRELESS SETUP

These devices do not feature physical DMX connector ports. Therefore, in order to utilize DMX control, the user must first set up the devices to run wireless DMX control. Follow the directions below to configure wireless DMX control:

- 1. First, select the DMX Channel Mode for that you would like the device to operate in. Press MODE until the "DMX Settings" menu is displayed on the screen. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "DMX Channel Mode," then press the SETUP button.
- 2. Use UP and DOWN to scroll through the DMX Channel Mode options, then press SETUP to confirm your selection.
- 3. Next, enable the device's wireless capability. Press MODE until the "Personality" menu is displayed on the screen, then use UP and DOWN to scroll to "Wireless Settings" and press SETUP.
- 4. Use UP and DOWN to scroll to "Enable Wireless," then press SETUP to select this option.
- 5. Use UP and DOWN once again to toggle this setting to "Yes," then confirm by pressing SETUP.
- 6. Next, select the Wireless channel. Press MODE until the "Personality" menu is displayed on the screen again, then use UP and DOWN to scroll to "Wireless Settings" and press SETUP.
- 7. Use UP and DOWN to scroll to "Set Wireless Channel," then press SETUP again.
- 8. Now use UP and DOWN to scroll to your desired Wireless channel. Selectable values range from 00 to 15.
- 9. Finally, set the DMX address. Press the MODE button until the "DMX Settings" menu is displayed on the screen, then use UP and DOWN to scroll to "DMX Address," then press SETUP.
- 10. Use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to your desired DMX address, then press SETUP to confirm your selection. Available values range from 001 to 512. Refer to the *DMX Addressing* section of this manual for detailed guidance. Repeat these steps for each individual unit that you wish to use.

#### WIRELESS SETUP

There are many factors that can affect and/or interrupt a wireless signal, including walls, glass, metal, objects, and people. Therefore, the following guidelines are recommended in order to maximize the chances of having a clear path for the wireless signal to reach the device:

- Install the device a minimum of 9.8 ft (3m) above audiences and/or ground level.
- · Arrange the wireless antenna in an upright, vertical position.
- Position devices in direct line of sight of the transmitting controller.

Careful planning and testing of the selected installation location is critical to ensure optimum and reliable wireless operation.



#### IR REMOTE

The unit can only be controlled when it has been set to Primary mode. The unit will NOT respond to commands when it has been set to Secondary mode. When using the remote to control multiple units that are operating in primary/secondary mode, follow these steps to set up the units:

- 1. Power on the unit, and press MODE to scroll to the "Personality" menu.
- 2. Press SETUP, then use the UP and DOWN buttons to scroll to "Primary" or "Secondary" depending on the how you would like this unit to operate. Press SETUP to make your selection, and then use the UP and DOWN buttons to switch the option to ON.
- 3. Press SETUP to confirm and return to the "Personality" menu.
- 4. Use UP and DOWN to scroll to "Wireless Settings" and select "Set Wireless Channel." Press SETUP and use UP and DOWN to set the unit to your desired Wireless channel. Repeat these steps for each unit. Please note that all units should be set to the same Wireless channel.

#### NOTES:

- Only one unit should be configured as the primary, while all the other units should be configured as secondaries.
- All units in the system should be set to the same wireless channel. If all units are set to the same wireless channel, and the units do not sync up and/or respond to commands, try using a different wireless channel.
- All units should be set to the same DMX channel mode.
- If fixtures fail to sync, verify that all settings mentioned above are the same, then power all devices off, then switch them on again to re-establish the link.

#### **UC IR24 CONTROLS**

- On: Fixture turns on and reverts to the last running state
- Off: Fixture goes into stand by mode in a blackout state.
- Strobe: Actives strobe mode. The strobe rate can be adjusted using the + / - buttons.
- **Sound:** This button has no defined function for this unit.
- Color: Activates color mode. Select a static color (0-15) using the number keys. The intensity for the set color can then be adjusted with the +/- buttons.
- **Program:** Activates program mode. Select an internal program (0-15) using the number keys. The selected program run speed can be adjusted with the +/- buttons. *Note: 13 of the 15 buttons will activate a program for this unit.*
- **+ and buttons:** Adjusts strobe rate, mic sensitivity, intensity, or program run speed. The +/- buttons can be repeatedly pressed to increase or decrease by individual level increments, or pressed and held to quickly make large adjustments at once.
- Number Keys (0-15): These buttons are used to select preset static colors and internal programs. Colors stored in the number keys can be edited from the units menu if desired.



#### **IP RATING**

The Mirage Q IP is *IP65* rated. It is completely dust tight, and is protected against low-pressure directed jets of water from any direction. *Note that the charging base in NOT protected against moisture or dust intrusion of any kind, and should be used only in a dry, indoor setting!* 

#### FLAMMABLE MATERIAL WARNING!

Keep device a minimum of 5.0 feet (1.5m) away from flammable material and/or pyrotechnics.

#### **ELECTRICAL CONNECTIONS**

A qualified electrician should be used for all electrical connections and/or installations.

#### DO NOT INSTALL THE DEVICE IF YOU ARE NOT QUALIFIED TO DO SO!

The unit **MUST** be installed following all local, national, and country commercial electrical and construction codes and regulations.

Before installing or mounting any device, a professional equipment installer **MUST** be consulted to determine whether the mounting structure or surface is properly certified to safely support the combined weight of the fixture, clamps, cables, and accessories.

Operating temperature range is **32 to 113 degrees F (0 to 45 degrees C)**. Do not operate the device if ambient temperatures fall outside of this range.


This fixture should be installed in areas outside walking paths, seating areas, and areas where unauthorized personnel might be able to reach the device by hand.

**NEVER** stand directly below the fixture when rigging, removing, or servicing.

Allow approximately 15 minutes for the fixture to cool down before servicing.

#### **CLAMP INSTALLATION**

The Mirage Q IP features a mounting clamp attachment point on the side of the device (see the illustration below). When mounting the fixture to a truss or any other suspended or overhead installation, be sure to secure appropriately rated clamps (not included) to the clamp attachment point.



#### RIGGING

Overhead rigging requires extensive experience, including but not limited to: calculating working load limits, understanding the installation material being used, and periodic safety inspection of all installation material and the fixture itself. If you lack these qualifications, do not attempt to perform the installation yourself. Improper installation can result in bodily injury.

#### CHARGING PORT CAP

In order to maintain IP65 integrity, the charge port of each device must be sealed off using the attached rubber cap when the charging port is not in use.





#### KICKSTAND FOR FLOOR PLACEMENT

The Mirage Q IP can also be placed on the floor to provide an uplighting display, and features a retractable kickstand that allows the device to be angled in the direction of the desired display. **Make sure that the rubber cap is secured over the charge port to maintain the device's IP65 rating.** 

To deploy the kickstand, simply toggle the switch on the underside of the device, near the power charging port (1). The kickstand can then be deployed from the underside (2) at various notched increments, allowing a maximum angle of 35 degrees from the vertical axis (3).


Note: If set and activated, the alarm will be triggered by any movement of the device, including knocking over the device. The alarm will sound and the device will strobe red for the amount of time that was set in the "Alarm Time" setting, but will automatically stop when the device is returned to its place. Please be aware of this feature in the event that you decide to re-locate or re-position the device after the initial setup!






## **KENSINGTON KEY SLOT**

The device features a slot for a Kensington-type security device that can be used to prevent theft. The key slot is located near the bottom of one of the device's feet, as shown in the illustration below. Be sure to attach the security device to a sturdy, fixed anchor point.



#### **CONTROL PANEL**

This fixture includes an easy to navigate control panel display, from which all necessary settings and adjustments can be made. Press the **MODE** button to scroll through the main menu options, then press **SET UP** to select the currently displayed option. Then use the **UP** and **DOWN** buttons to scroll through the sub-menu options until reaching the desired setting. Press the **MODE** button at any time to return to the main menu without making any adjustments.
